Motion was made by Jackson, seconded by Fleming, to accept the bid from White's to strip and wax the tile floors and to provide a case of Damp Mop tile cleaner at cost of \$2,350.00. After discission, all in favor.

A. Kuenkel made an oral presentation of a program to pay certain Department members for overnight duty. Pay rates would be \$20.00—\$50.00, depending on training and experience. The program would be funded by the District Recruitment & Retention budget and the Department budget, and would be retroactive to 1 January 2022. Motion was made by T. Kuenkel, seconded by Jackson, to approve this proposal pending documentation. After much discussion, all in favor.

There being no further business, motion was made by T. Kuenkel, seconded by Fleming, to adjourn the meeting. All in favor, and the meeting was adjourned at 8:23 p.m.,
